MISSION

Macris School is a Catholic bilingual institution that strives to develop the mind, body, and spirit of every student. We seek to develop students of integrity who are prepared both academically and spiritually to excel in higher education and to be lifelong learners and leaders of positive change.

ABOUT MACRIS

Macris is a Pre-K-12 school that is divided into preschool, elementary school (1-6) and high school (7-12) that enrolls approximately 1,000 students yearly. The school follows American and Honduran academic programs. Students are divided into three sections by grade of approximately 22-27 students in which they take classes together as a group. Academic levels of students are mixed each year according to academic achievement and analysis of conduct.

Macris High School has a college preparatory curriculum that prepares students to graduate earning both a Honduran and U.S. diploma. 80% of our classes are taught in English, while Honduran culture classes are taught in Spanish (Civics, Spanish, Honduran History, etc.) as required by the Honduran Ministry of Education. Our students graduate earning both, a local Honduran diploma (known in Spanish as Bachillerato) and a U.S. High School diploma. Seniors are also required to complete 144 hours of community service, which usually consist of teaching English or literacy skills to Honduran children or adults in their local communities.

2020-2021 VIRTUAL LEARNING PROGRAM

During the first semester of the 2020-2021 school year, Macris School is holding online classes in a 100% virtual learning environment, due to the Covid-19 pandemic. A regular class day consists of four, 1-hour synchronous class periods with a two hour after-class period for asynchronous activities. All subjects are accounted for, on a six-day rotating schedule, which includes among others, Religion, Art, P.E., Music and a period after each regular class day in which teachers hold office

GPA CALCULATION

GPA calculation is based on the academic model suggested by College Board. Students normally take 40 credits per school year except for students who take AP courses or those who only complete the U.S. diploma and not the Honduran one. Our students are ranked by their weighted cumulative average from 9th - 12th grade.

HONOR ROLL

The breakdown of our Honor Roll marks is the following: High Honor Roll (95%-100%), Honor Roll (90%-94%) and Honorable Mention (85%-89%). In addition to achieving the specified averages, students must demonstrate excellent citizenship during each specfic quarter.

AWARDS AND DISTINCTIONS

Macris has won 1st place overall in the National Bilingual Math Olympics for 16 out of 17 years; 15 of them consecutively between 2001 and 2020. No event was hosted in 2009, 2017, and 2020. Macris teams earned Perfect Scores in every single one of the seven categories of this competition at the 2010, 2015 and 2019 National Bilingual Math Olympics; setting this and a number of other records along the way in Honduran Math Olympics history. Also, in the first three years of the National Bilingual Math Bowl, Macris won 2nd place overall (2017, 2019) and won 1st place overall (2018) by placing 1st in all three categories of the competition. Macris is also the only school with a record of 8 out of the 9 finals in all categories during the three year lifespan of the competition. No event was hosted in 2020.
